Ulysses S. Howard, Sr., grew up in South Georgia (Waverly & Brunswick), the third of twelve children born to Barty and Beatrice Howard. After graduating high school, he enlisted in the U.S. Army where he served for three years, achieving the rank of Sergeant First Class. While serving his country, Howard had the opportunity to attend the University of Maryland, majoring in business management.
