FMU is among the leading HBCUs in the nation leveraging partnerships with public and corporate partners to develop academic training and certification programs in emerging markets such as Aviation Management and Environmental Science, Cybersecurity, and Computer Information Technology. Its academic programs are accredited by the Association of Collegiate Business Schools and Programs, the Aviation Accreditation Board International, the Computing Accreditation Commission of ABET, the National Association of Schools of Music, Council on Social Work Education, and its Teacher Education programs are approved by the Florida Department of Education. FMU also offers a robust study abroad program and award-winning Broadcast Communications and Public Relations programs.

The university is also part of the National Association of Intercollegiate Athletics (NAIA) and the Sun Conference and offers eight collegiate sports programs, including men/women's basketball, men/women soccer, men/women's track and field, baseball and volleyball.
